This funding will be used to

- To enact our explicit improvement agenda \rightarrow Reading, Writing, Numeracy and Culture.
- Increase the number of students at or above National Minimum Standard in year 9 reading, writing and numeracy. Reading and Maths over a 12-month period January to December.
- To ensure all students to meet or exceed the College attendance rate ≥ 95%, and reduce students attending < 85%.
- To reduce incidents of non-compliant student behaviour and reduce the number of SDAs.
- Assist in the attainment of a Queensland Certificate of Education / Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement for all graduating students in 2022.

Our initiatives include

- Implement a whole school approach to improve writing through the engagement of "Writers Toolbox", and focussed and intensive support for students requiring additional support through our MacqLit program.
- Improve support services and case management and intervention for targeted and at-risk students.
- Enact the BPSSC Marker Student Concept in 2022.
- Build a strong sense of belonging in our large and multi-cultural school by employing community and cultural liaison staff.
- Provide release time for our teachers to prepare units of work for year 12, 2022.
