RETURN TO FACE TO FACE LEARNING

- First day face to face learning is Monday 7 February.
- Year 7 students are to arrive at school no later than 8.40am and move to R & S Block Courtyard to check their roll class allocation and classrooms. Heads of Year will be there to support students in the Year Level Areas.
- Year 7: R & S Block Courtyard
- When the first bell rings, students will move to their roll class classroom with their bags and belongings.
- Welcome back notices, timetables and diaries will be issued by Roll Class/Pathways Teachers in their timetabled classroom.
- Parents and carers should drop-off and pick-up their children at the designated safe drop-off zone at the main entrance to the college. In accordance with the Qld Government Back to School plan - parents and carers should remain in their vehicles to minimise group gatherings and not walk onto the college campus to collect their children or congregate at the main entrance when collecting your child/ren.

WHAT TO BRING

- Students will need to bring their equipment ready to work and learn on day 1 this will include bag, books, pens and hat.
- Students can bring their morning tea and lunch or access our college canteen facilities.
- Facemasks are compulsory and students are required to bring their own to school. Parents/carers please ensure your students have back up masks stored in their bag for hygiene and in the event of breakages.
- Facemasks are compulsory on public transport this will include buses to and from school.
- Please do not send your student to school if they are sick or exhibit symptoms of being sick in line with current COVID guidelines and advice from our Chief Health Officer.

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JEWELLERY

- Minimal jewellery that is workplace, health and safety compliant is acceptable.

HAIR & MAKE-UP

All students at the College are to be neat and tidy, well-groomed, and the following must be adhered to, at a minimum:

- Hairstyles must be neat, clean, tidy and well-maintained.
- Long hair (hair that is longer than collar length) is to be tied back.
- Hair must not be coloured or dyed a non-natural colour.
- Hairstyles such as mo-hawks, undercuts, tracks or rat's tails are not permitted.
- Accessories are not permitted, these include, but are not limited to, bandanas, beanies, other brightly coloured or patterned headwear or accessory.
- Eyeliner, eye shadow, mascara and other make up is not permitted.
- Nail polish, nail patterns/art and nail jewellery are not permitted.
- False nails or nail attachments are not permitted.
- Cultural Tattoos, if present, must be covered by the College Uniform.
- Uniform is to be purchased from the BPSSC Uniform Shop.
- Look-alike items are not acceptable.
- The BPSSC bucket hat or cap is the only permitted hat.
- White undershirts/singlets may be worn, but must not be visible.
- BPSSC understands that some cultures and religions have specific dress requirements. Head Scarves worn for religious reason must be navy blue or white- no decorations or tassels.

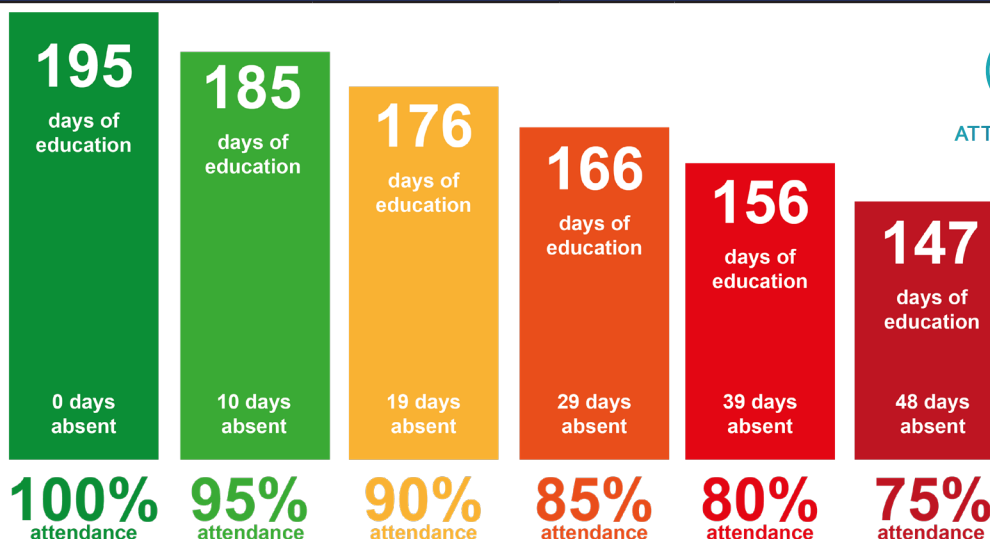
STUDENT ATTENDANCE
